THE UNIVERSITY OF RICHMOND

The University of Richmond, largest private college or university in Virginia, was founded in 1830 and is located on a 350-acre campus in suburban Richmond. The University's full-time enrollment is approximately 3,000 and its total enrollment is 6,000.

Westhampton College for women and Richmond College for men are the liberal arts undergraduate colleges of the University. Other divisions include the School of Business Administration, T. C. Williams School of Law, the Graduate School, and University College.

The Music Department offers the advantages of being both small enough to allow for individual growth and development, and large enough to provide a wide variety of musical activities. The department offers the Bachelor of Arts degree in music; the Bachelor of Music in Performance, Theory/history, Music Education, Church Music, or Commercial Music; and the Master of Music in Performance, Choral Conducting, Church Music, or Music Education. The faculty consists of nine full-time and 16 part-time members. Part-time faculty providing applied music instruction in winds and strings are members of the Richmond Symphony.
